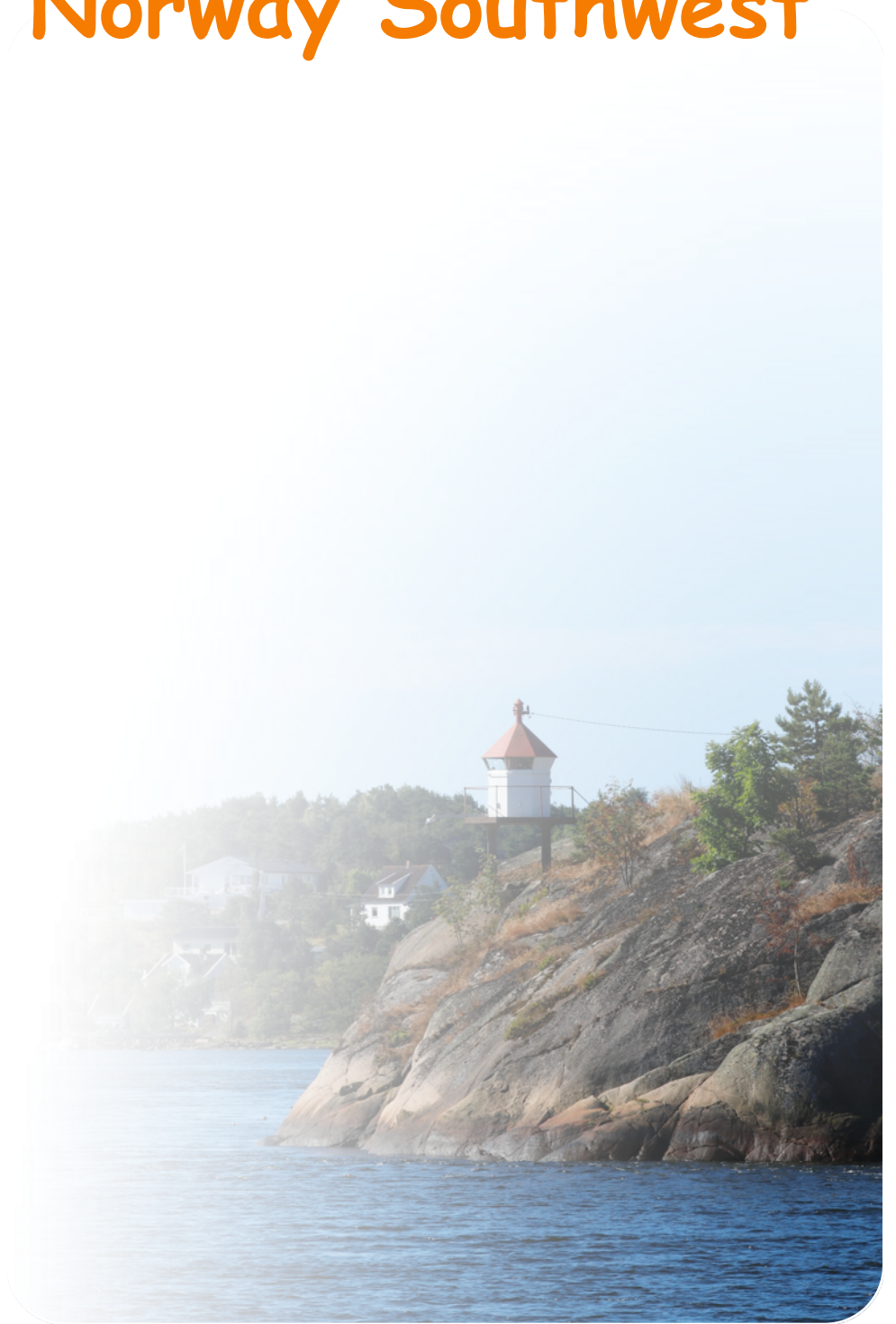

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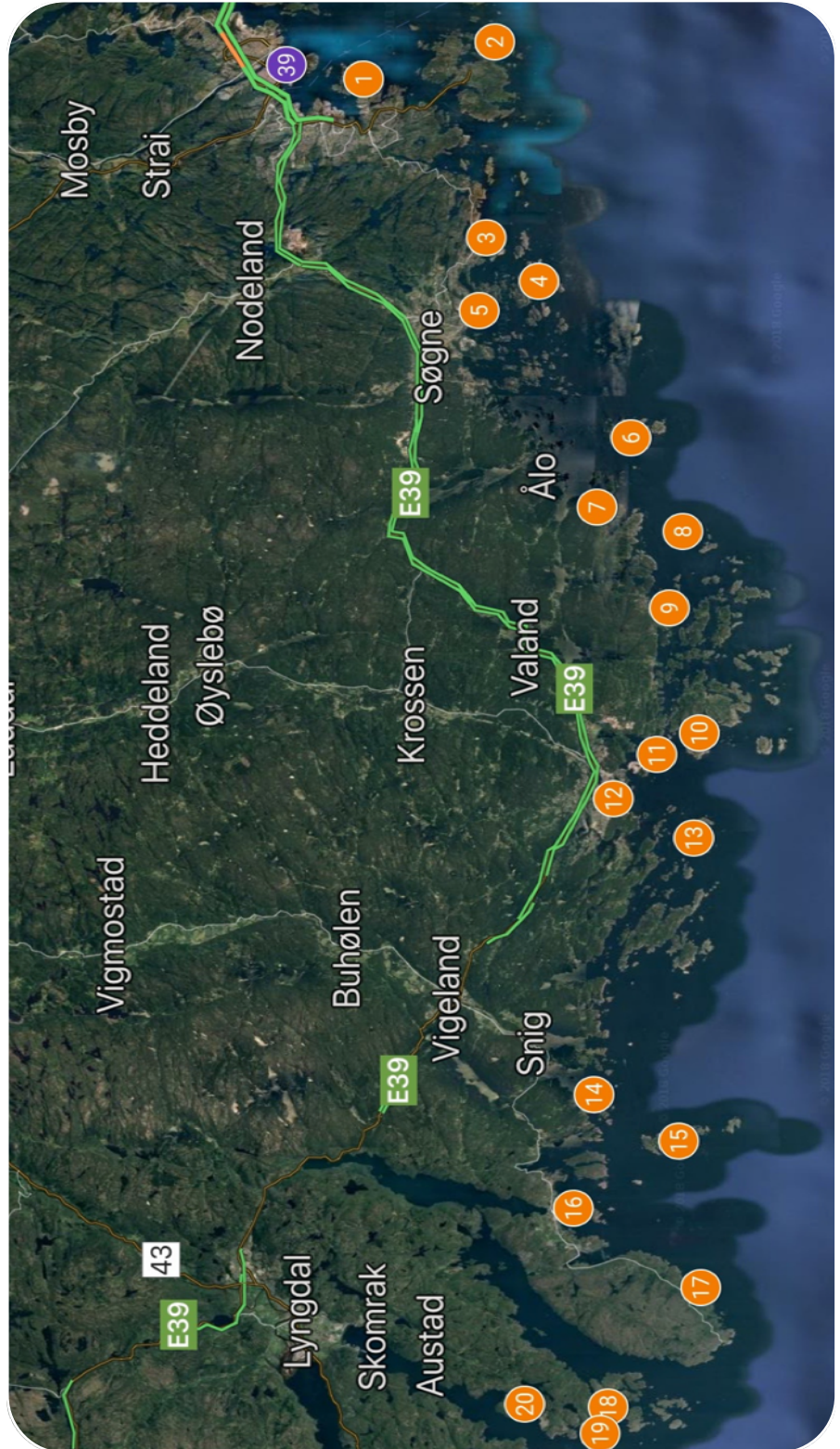

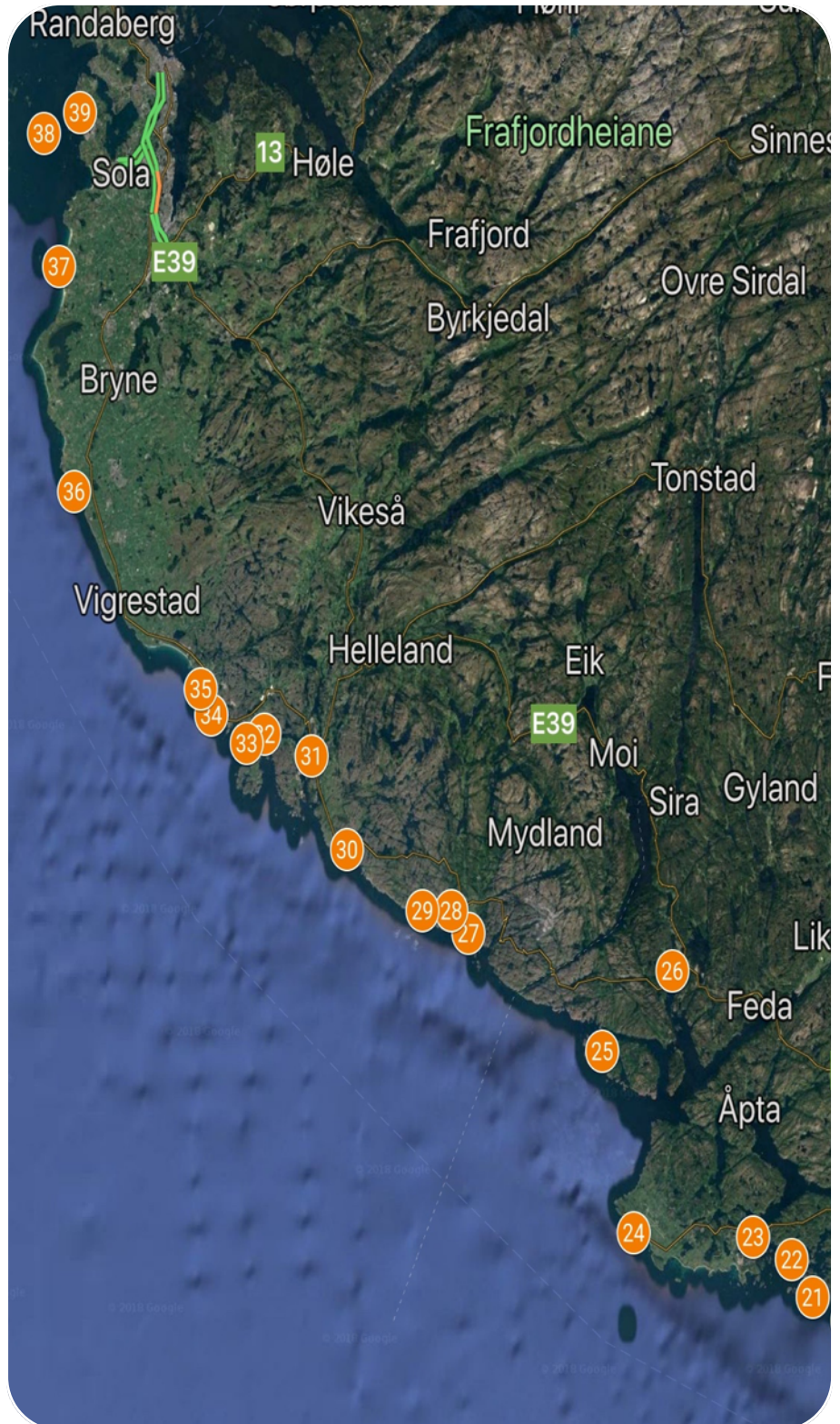

## Hestehodet

Bragdøya and the surrounding islands is open space and is owned by Kristiansand Municipality. At the southeast point is Hestehodet and Kongshavn. This is an excellent natural harbor and you are sheltered in most weather conditions. It is well facilitated with piers and mooring bolts. The entrance is easy on both sides of Hestholmen.

## Herøya

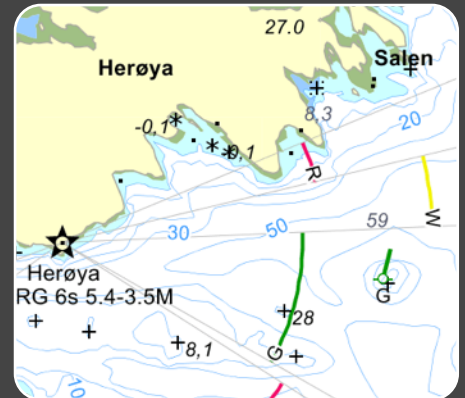

Herøya is quite large and is well protected beyond Langnes and Nodeneset. It's southern bays on the east side which is nice for boaters. The entrance from the east is hassle free. Keep clear of Skinka, the not visible shear east of the island, and the visible shear beyond the entrance, it is deep ashore. Inside the bay there are warm and nice in all conditions.

## Olavssundet

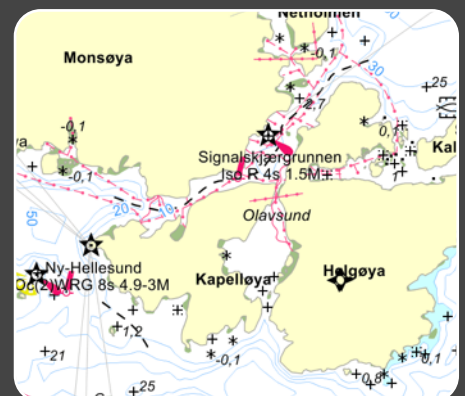

The name "Hellesund" comes from "The Holy Strait". A 1000-year-old legend tells of how the new faith struck through mountains, leaving the old faith in stone as a shear. Olav's profile was victorious again, carved in the rock, you see it up at port side, as you come out of the strait. St. Olav sailed in competition with his half brother Harald Hardråde, when the mountain split, and Olav could sail through. The Trollhag, who tried to stop Olav, turned to stone, and fell into the strait behind him and prevented the persecutor. St. Olav won the race and became king, and the old hag is there to hinder boat traffic yet. Now she is abundantly marked with an iron take. Whether one takes the legend literally or not, Olav Sundet a magnificent harbor.

The best port in Udværkilen located to the northwest. You are a bit susceptible if it blows right into the bay, but even then the harbor is surprisingly sheltered.

## Fugløy

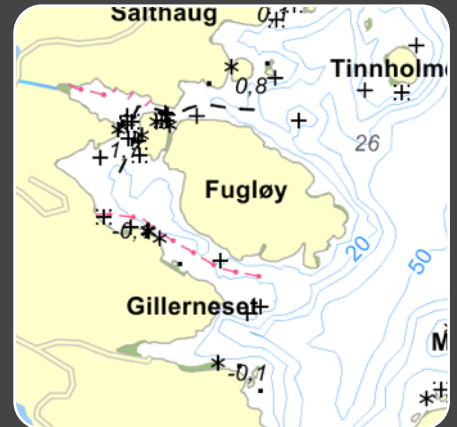

## Vestre Hærholmen

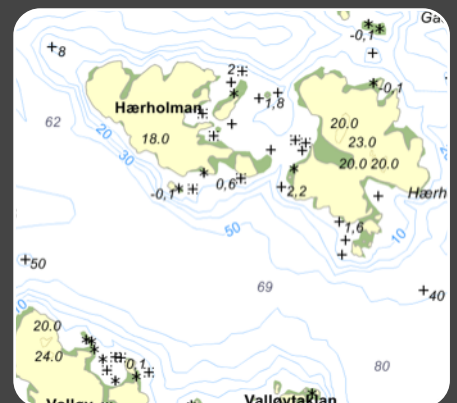

## Orpeholmen

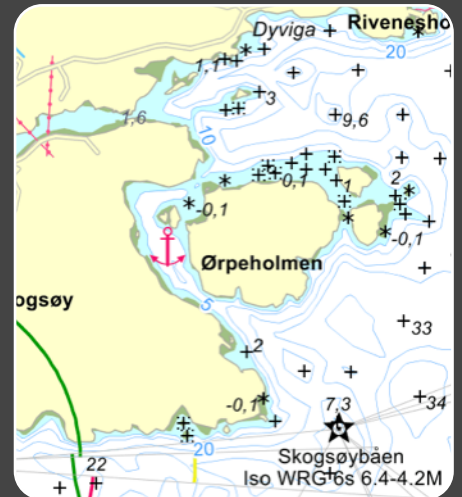

Orpeholmen close to Skogsøy, and just to the south is Skogsøybåen beacon. The island is just north of the inner strait and is a convenient place to moor for the night. In the Orpholmsundet between Skogsøy and Orpeholmen you are sheltered for all wind directions.

## Dyrestadvågen

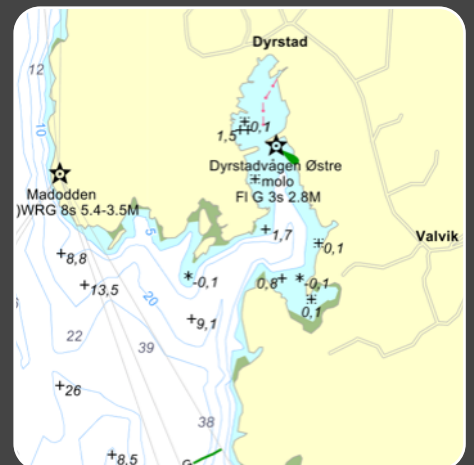

Dyrestadvågen is located on the western side of Skjernøy. This is a small breakwater harbor with old seaside housing. There are many private berths and boys, but you can moor on the inside of the breakwater. Depths from 2-4 meters. Be aware of some shears inside of the breakwater.

## Stussøy

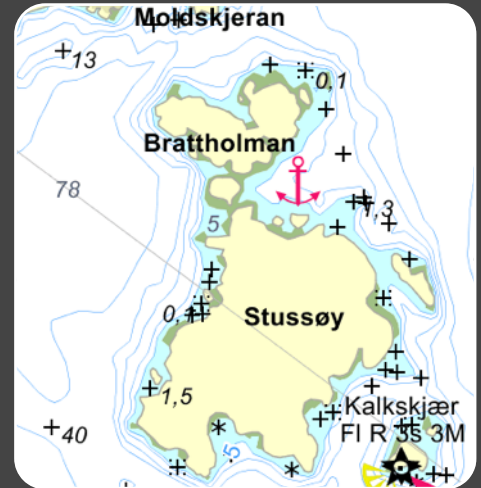

Mandal Guest Harbor is located in Mandalselva and is centrally located in relation to the city's facilities. Mandal has Sjøsandene which is often called the finest sandy beach in Norway, close to 1 km long and within walking distance of the marina facility. The same is Furulunden that surrounds Sjøsandene and is a recreational area with many trails for use in both exercise and walking.

## Ytre Mannevær

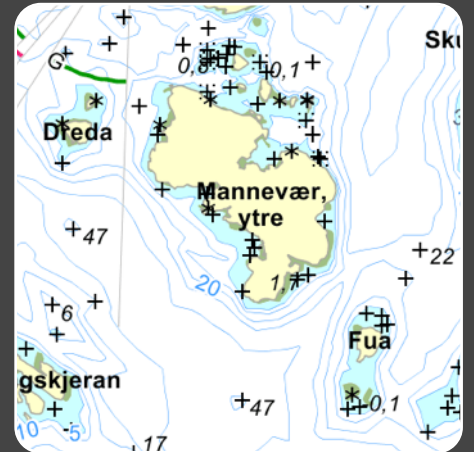

## Svinør

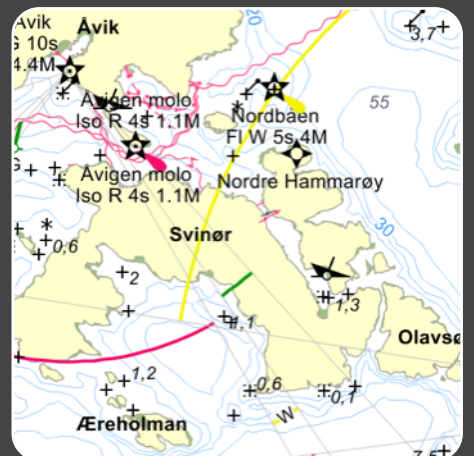

# Våre

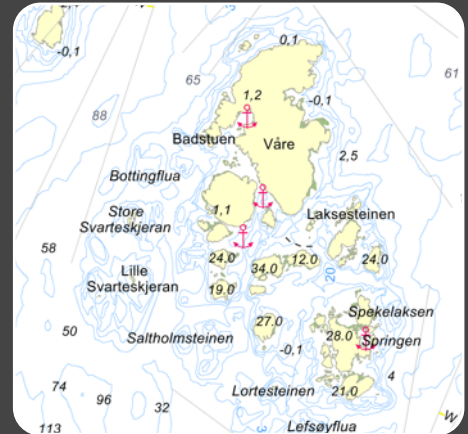

# Båly

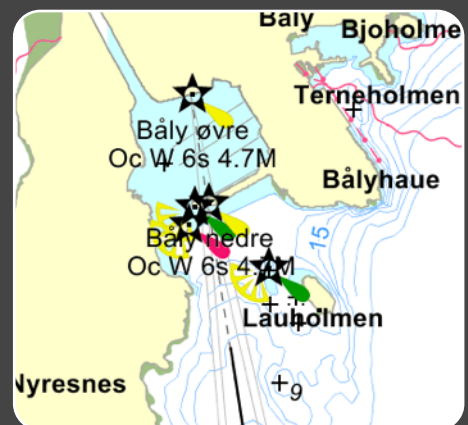

There is a fishery and fishing pier in the harbor. 12 km drive to Lindesnes Lighthouse, 4 km to Children's Animal Park and 1 km to Spangereid Vikingland.

## Lillehavn

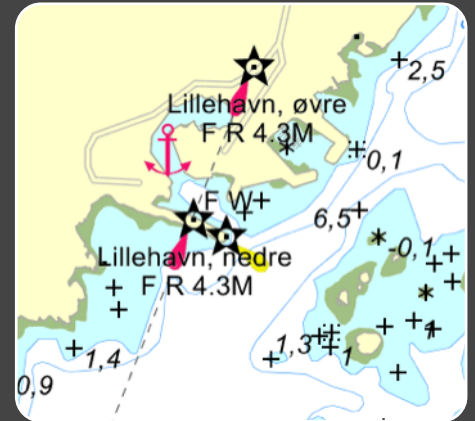

## Korshavn

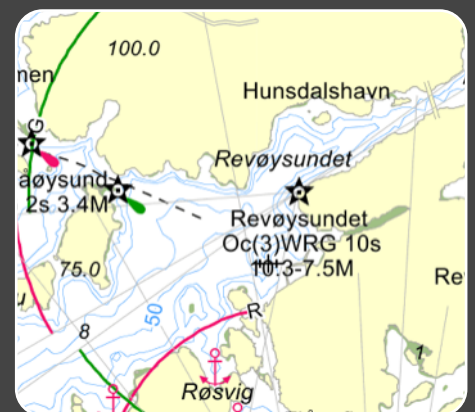

## Sutnøybukta

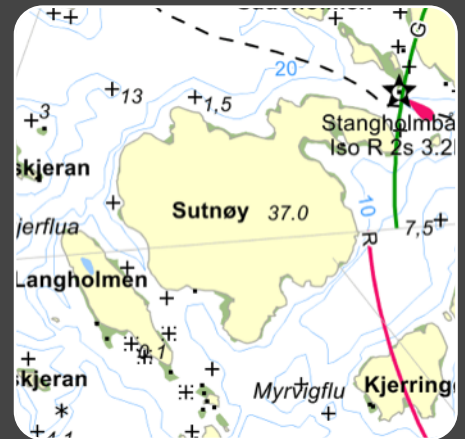

## Børøy

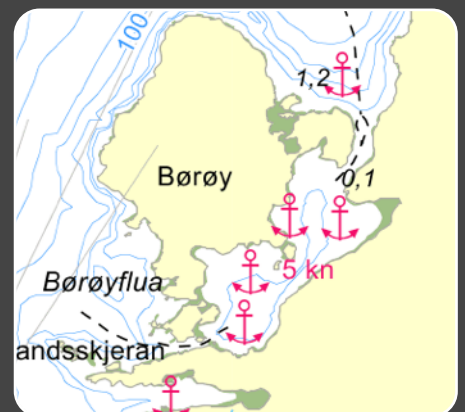

## Ullerøyhavn

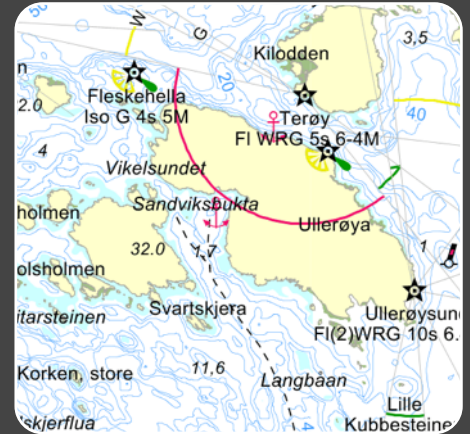

## Skutevik

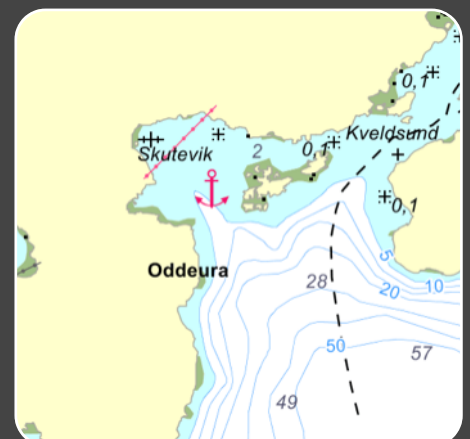

## Listahavn

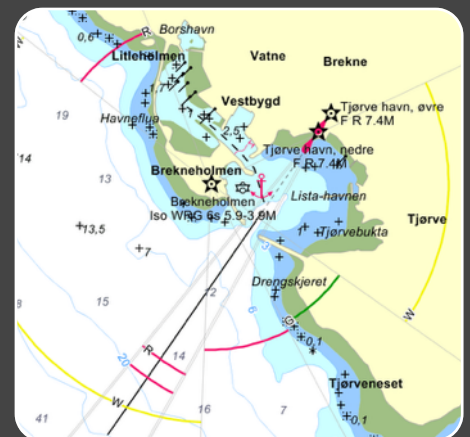

Lista is a natural division point in the landscape. Heading west from here the landscape changes character. Along Lista beaches looks inviting but there are few opportunities to dock your boat. On nice days it is possible to lie at anchor off a beach, not many days a season in these waters. Lista Harbor, or Borshavn as the inner part is called, is a safe breakwater harbor.

## Kirkehamn

Kirkehamn, is a port and is considered as the main place on the island of Hydra in Flekkefjord municipality in West Agder. The place is located in an enclosed harbor area west of Hydra. Hydra Church, an octagonal and cross-shaped church from 1854, is clearly visible in the sailing from the sea. The building environment, is largely well taken care of. Kirkehamn is a well-preserved cultural heritage in the form of buildings, stone fences, retaining walls and clearance cairns. The place has a long history of fishing and seafaring. Settling Findings from the Stone Age is detected in peat beds out in the port

## Sogndalstrand

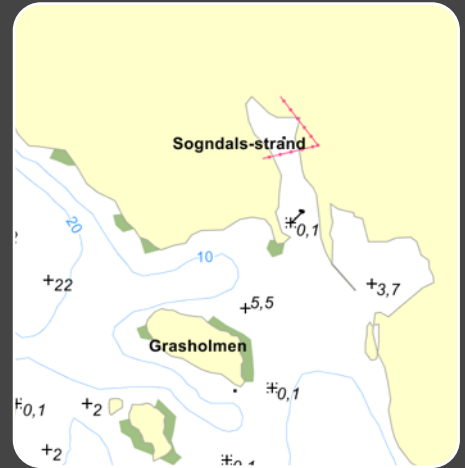

The old wooden buildings are well maintained, and there are hotels and some shops. Just northwest of Sogndalstrand is Rekefjord (28) and Nesvåg (29).

The entrance is well marked with a green flashing light at the tip of the pier and a red light on Sirevågsiden. A the alignment light marks the entrance when coming within the breakwater. Mooring system: Behind the pier or in the harbor.

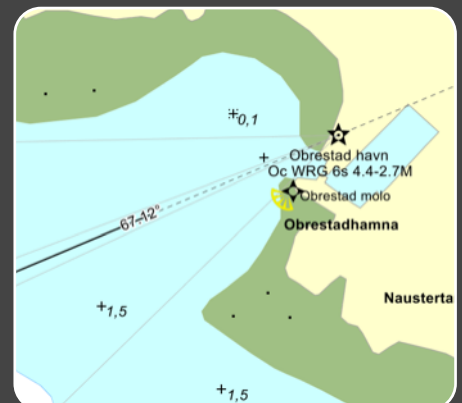
Obrestad harbor, municipal dock with water, electricity,

Obrestad harbor was the first harbor on Jæren. The harbor was built in the same period as the Jærbanen in the 1870s. The idea was to build a place where boats could get shelter and aid along the coast of Jæren. This port facility was expanded in 1891.

Today, the smaller fishing port is protected,

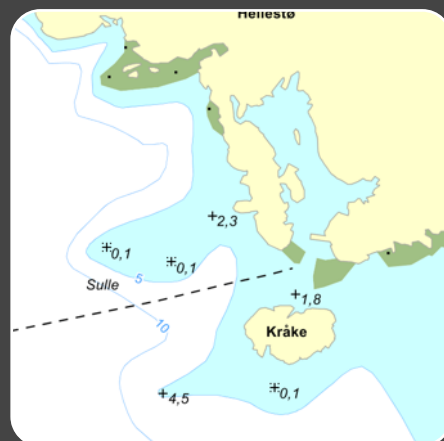

Good harbor. Enter north or west. Be careful. If you are unknown in the waters, please refer to The Norwegian Los which describes the entrance in detail.

Mooring system: bolts, pier. Depths 2 - 3 m.

Rich birdlife.

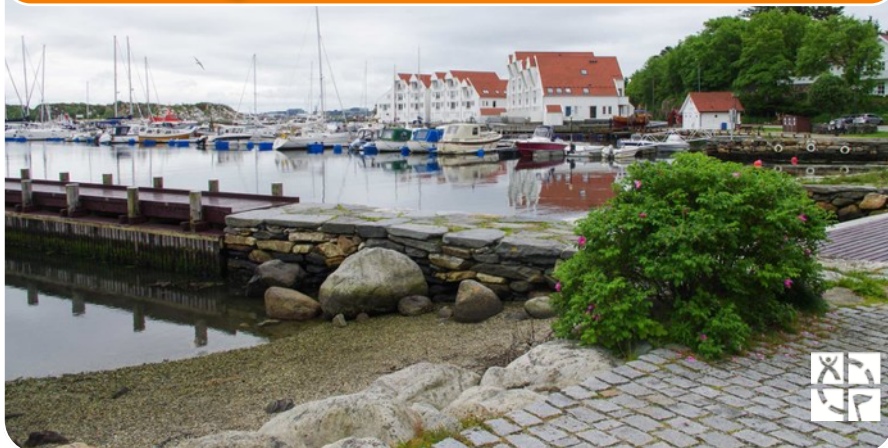

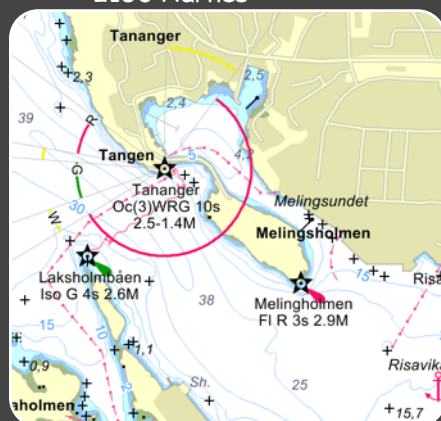


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
