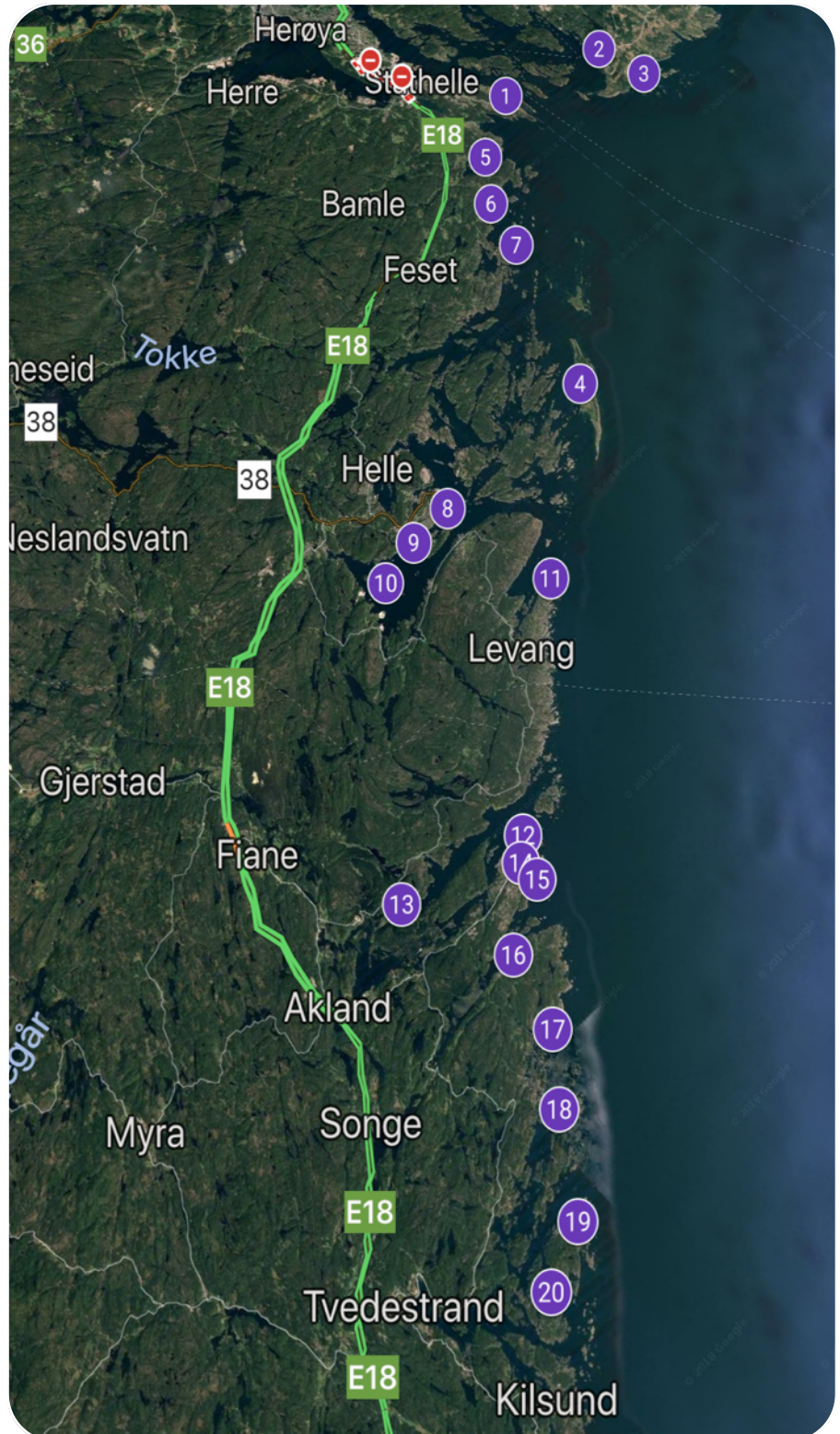

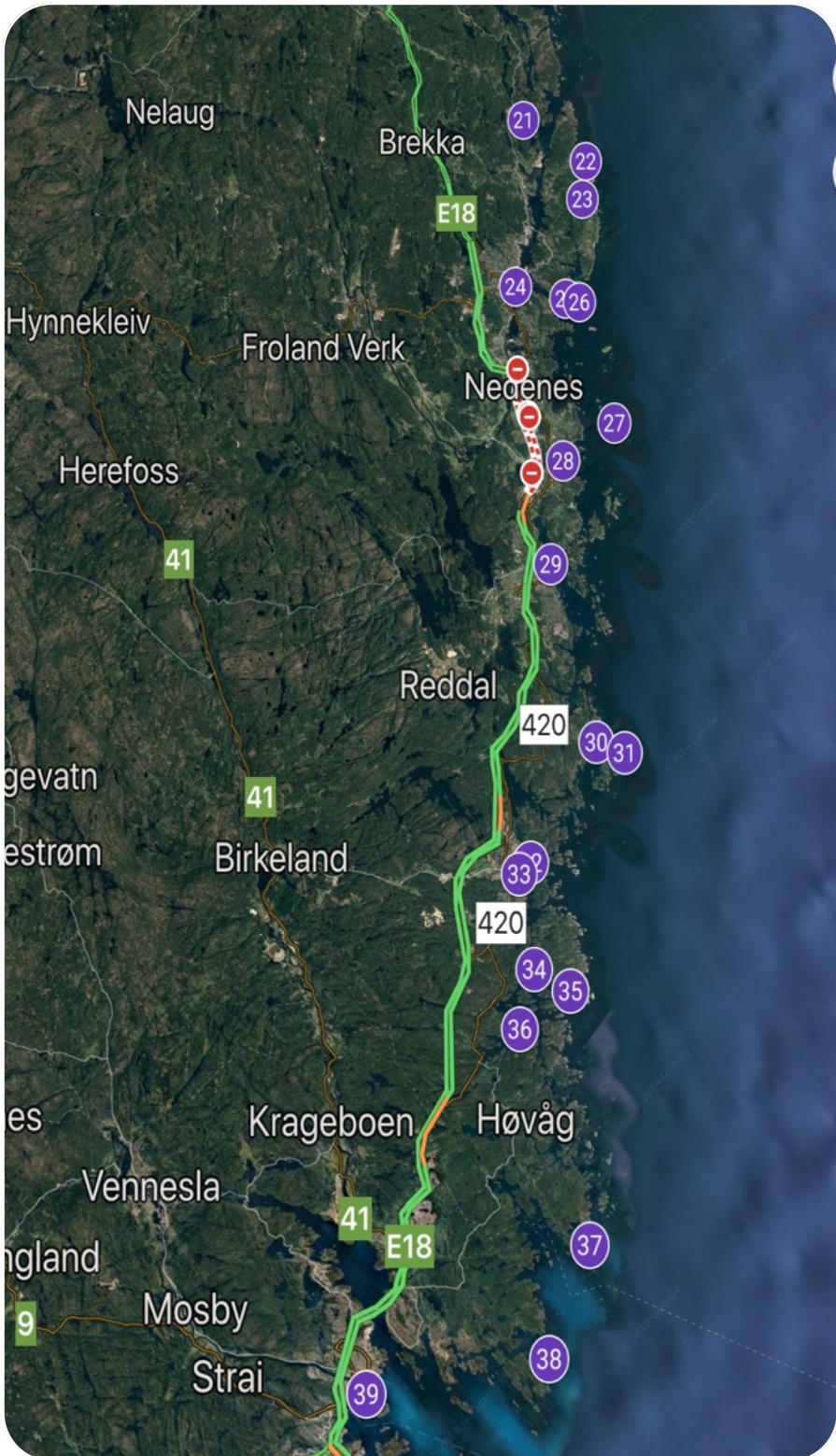

Langesund

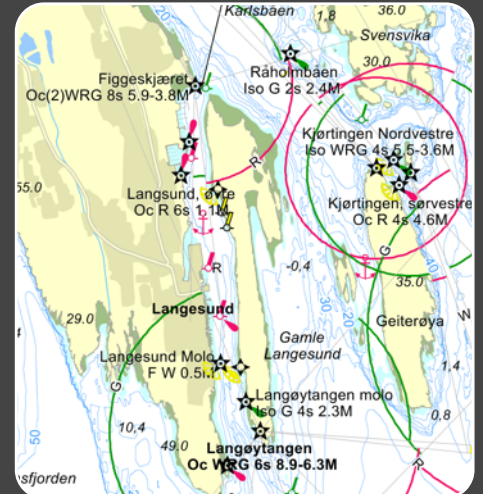

Langesund is a sheltered and safe harbor with rich traditions from the sailing season, which the city clearly shows. . Kongshavn is probably the lunest and most pleasant. The city's access is hassle-free and well-marked. Langesund is the place where the tourist information desk distributes rolls in the guest harbor throughout the summer

Helgeroa lies in the entrance to Grenland, idyllic to west and sunny. Here is a marina with all amenities and a welcoming harbor for boat tourists. In Helgeroa there are several cozy restaurants and shops.

Nevlunghavn is a small fishing harbor at the far end of Brunlaneset. The small village, with white wooden houses, is located just inside the Tvistein lighthouse.

Jomfruland

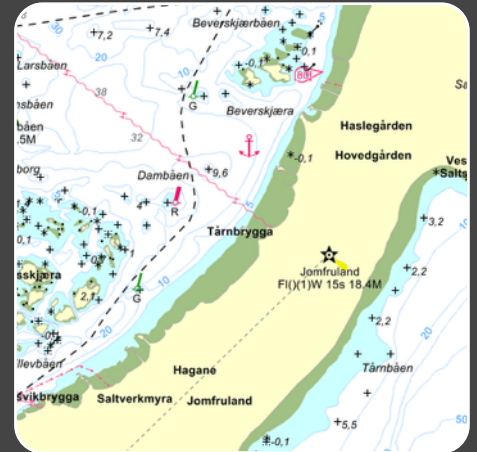

It is along Jomfrulandsrenna on the north side of the island you can add by boat. It is the guest harbor at the tower bridge in the middle of the island. Within the breakwater there is 1,5-2 meters deep. By floating docks outside is 2.8 meters. The entrance to the Jomfrulandsrenna trail is hassle free. It's nice to lie at anchor as well. Best anchor holding bottom at the area around Tårnbrygga, and south of Beverskjæra.

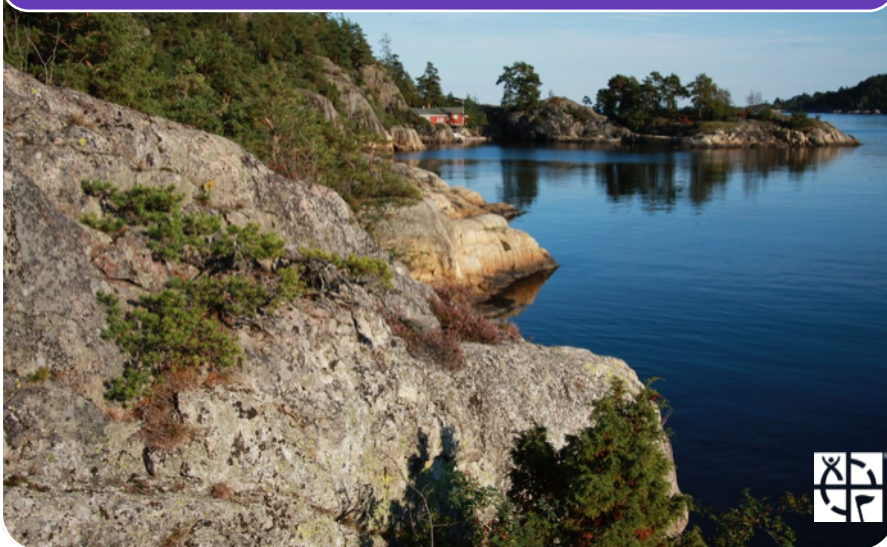

Skokleøya

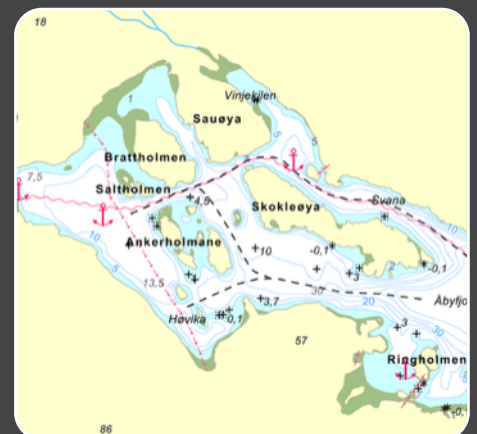

Skokleøya is located in Åbyfjorden just west of Langesund. Many rush past in order to progress to Kragerø, so here it is often plenty of space between the boats. Åbyfjorden is open to the east, so the harbor is a bit prone to eastern waters. In that case, Håvik (port no. 2) can be better. In all other winds are you well protected around Skokleøya. The island and the surrounding countryside are tall and wooded. In some places it may get a bit dark. The bay in the middle of the north side is slightly lower.

Brevikstranda

Brevikstranda is located in the heart of Brevikstrandfjorden. The bay is small enough to provide excellent shelter from all winds, but big enough that there is plenty of space to dock. You can lie on the bay in the bay or add to Haraldsøy or Veitholmen. The entrance is narrow, but decent enough when you follow the map and hold west of the reefs in the strait. In the center of the bay there is a campsite with many activities for children. Here you also get the most important of groceries.

Tonerhavn

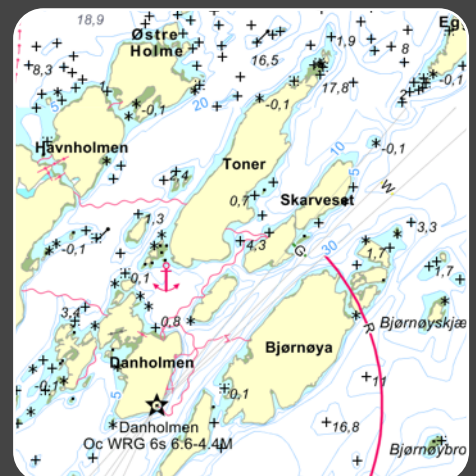

Toner harbor is an old anchorage from the sailing season. The harbor is located along Toner strait between Langesund and Valle. You will find shelter in most wind conditions, but the popular spot in the middle of Skarveset is exposed to the northeast. In the small bay on Skarveset is the mooring bolts and fine rocks. There is a narrow strait between the islands, but this is not wider than that you can stride from one island to the other. It is a shallow 1 meter just west of the strait. You can also lie at anchor in the bay southwest of the island Toner. This is the old Toner Port.

Kragerø

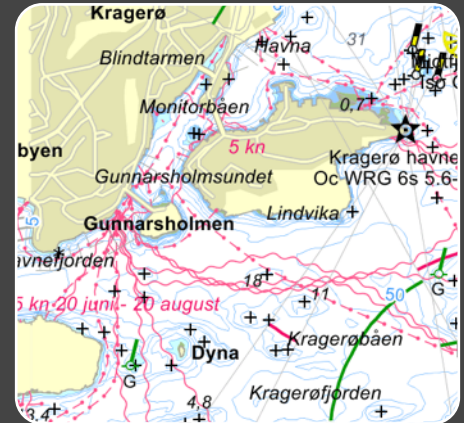

Kragerø marina has a fantastic location in the center of Kragerø. The pier is two-fold, so that one comes to the marina either coming from the south via Portør, or north via crimped. The northern part of the marina is located between the island and train Kaia where the Port Authority's office. South of downtown, but still protected by Gunnarsholmen, is the second part.

Sundholmen

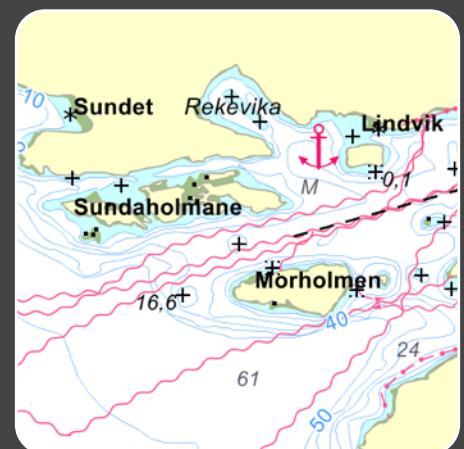

If you continue west from Kragerø into Kilsfjorden, you will arrive quite quickly to Sundholmene and Rekevika. Here is well organized for visitors by boat. There are toilets, piers and mooring bolts. In the center of Rekevika there is a pier and a nice sandy beach surrounded by swamps and grasslands. The lock is well in clay bottom. SundHolmene is quaint and beautifully shaped with steep mountains and round rocks which invite you to go ashore. Here you have the sun all day and until late in the evening.

West of Kragerø spreads Kilsfjord, Telemark itself inland. Here there are lesser cottage settlement, and often fewer boats than in the Kragerø archipelago. It is nice to moor to the rocks on both Djupsundholmene and Brattøy. North in Djupsundholmene there is a pier and beach. The fjord is generally very deep, and addition of anchor can be a challenge.

Outside Portør is an idyllic collection islets and rocks with as smooth skerries as ice and oceans have been able to get them. Too many are one day in the sun, well placed in a soft body-shaped part of the hard mountain, the very symbol of Norwegian boat summer. The hilly mountain formations manifest themselves under the sea as well, so you should navigate with caution. The approach from the south is the most cumbersome, but this is well marked with iron stakes. From the north you can find the inn along the mainland,

Bommen

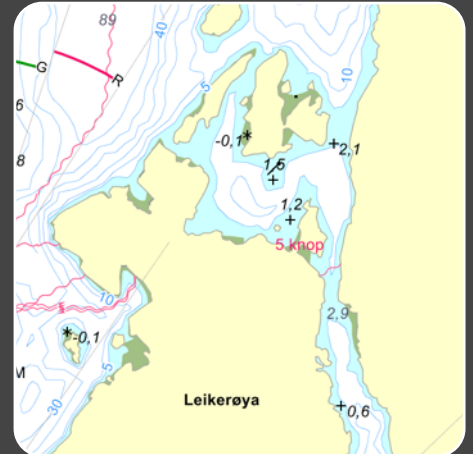

Within the islets north of Lekerøya at Risør, a lunatic and nice harbor is formed. The place is called Bommen, but also called "Pjolter Bay". Risør Motorboatforening has clubhouses and brews along Risøya. The piers are open to all. You can also land several places both towards Lekerøya and towards the islets. The entrance is easy from several edges to the seafront

Narvika

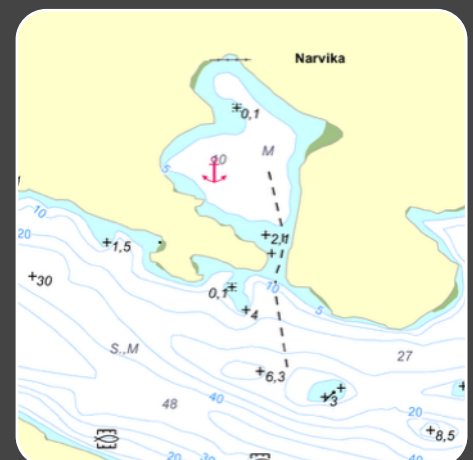

Narvika and Håvik are two bays next to each other in the northern fjord north of Barmen. Håvik is somewhat deeper and more open to the south, but the mountains around are tall and wooded, so it is stiff in most conditions. The high mountains make it a bit dark. Seepage is hassle free. You can lie at anchor or moor to shore. On the rocks north of the bay there are mooring bolts, good anchor bracket, and a small sandy beach. You can lie at anchor throughout the bay, but in bad weather is Narvik preferable.

Risør guest harbor is centrally located on the beach in the old town of Tangen and in the inner harbor at the square. The harbor is certified with the ecolabel "Blue Flag". Risør Sailing Association hosts the guest harbor, the port yards help with the location and mooring of the boat.

Stangholmen

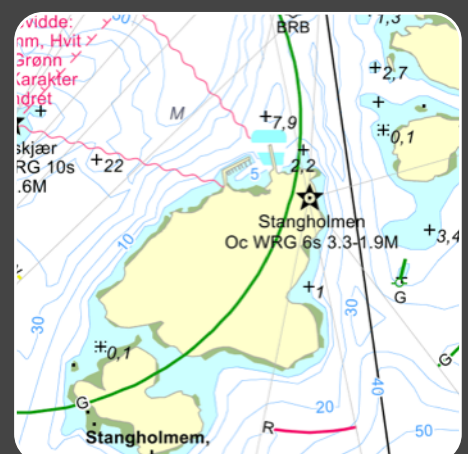

Stangholmen lighthouse is famous for anyone who has approached Risør from the south. If you come from far out at sea, you see Risørflekken before seeing other details in the city, and with the islet in the middle of stangholmen strait, you will clear shallow water at west. The lighthouse dates from 1855, while Risørflekken was calcined in the 1600s. You can add at Floating dock on the north side of the island

Saltbuholmen

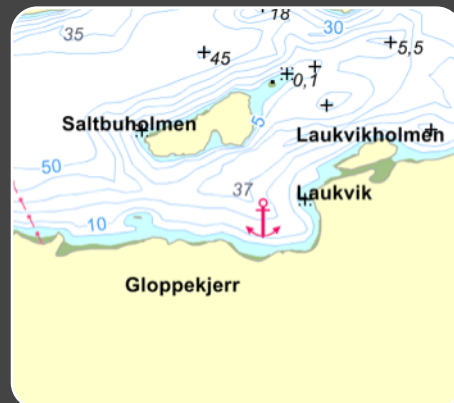

Sandesfjord southwest of Risør is narrow, and with tall wooded hills around. Saltbuholmen is just over a nautical mil in the fjord. Here it is sheltered and comfortable. The east wind may take a little. The entrance is easy if you follow the charts. Keep clear of the cuts in the west and northeast. You can choose to moor around the whole island, but the bay on the south is perhaps most tempting.

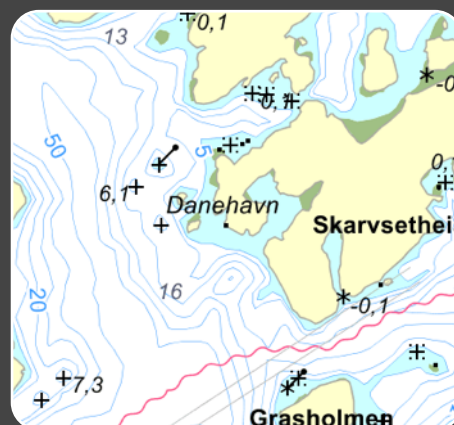

In Danehavn entrance is easy. Water is 3-4 meters deep. You can moor to the rocks where the boats are located in the picture, alongside or with the bow to shore. Sandy bottom gives a good grip. You are safe even in strong winds, and in beautiful surroundings.

Lyngør

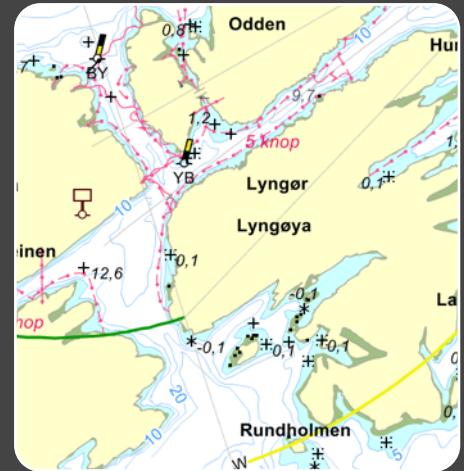

In Lyngør is the main street of saltwater. This is one of Europe's best preserved towns. It is with awe and feeling that you enter Lyngør for the first time. Here it is narrow to the fjord to be, but wide to be the gate. Old idyllic houses are located on row and row along the water's edge on both sides. The inlets are problem free after the map and well marked from all directions.

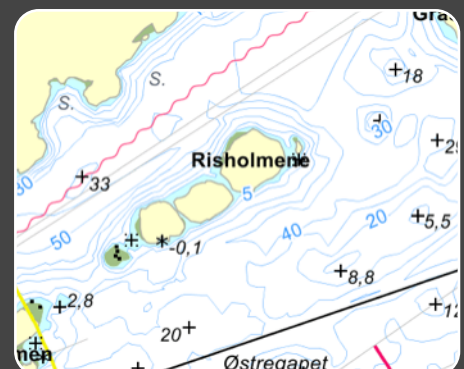

If you enter the inner lane within Flosta Island, you pass in the narrow straits at Klokkøya. It is really shallow waters, and poorly marked. The Norwegian Los provide good description of the fairway, and it is possible to get through with boats jutting 2 meters. The north side of Kolokkøya is a widely used nature harbor. Here it is well organized by the archipelago service and you are well protected.

Tromlingene

Tromlingene is low and characterized by pastures. The great grass plains in the middle of the bay are equally well liked by sheep as people. Here it is superb to put up tents, play football or whatever you have to have the desire. The harbor itself is good either lying at anchor or on land. The approach is straightforward sørøstfra, also in a certain swell. Tromlingene gives only moderate protection from wind from east and southwest. The island is low and with little vegetation.

Alvekilen is sticking deep into Tromøy southeast side. Here you can seek protection from southwesterly winds without going far into unavailable fjords. Alvekilen is a short detour for those who are on a long offshore cruise. The approach is simple under normal conditions. To the west of Danmarksfjell there are some skerries in the middle of the strait, you must keep to the south. There are few opportunities to moor to shore, so Alvekilen is a place most people lies at anchor .

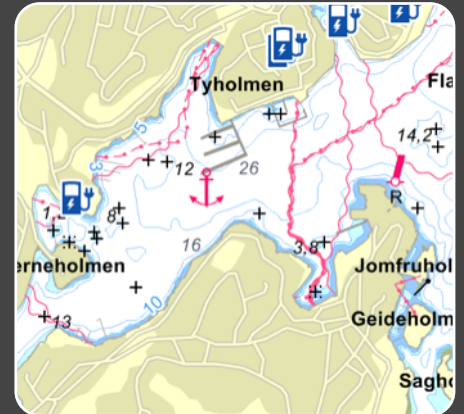

In Arendal Gjestehavn you will find Norway's first floating outdoor swimming pool. The temperature in the water should be around 25-26 degrees. Imagine having a refreshing swim at sea level with beautiful Tyholmen as a backdrop. The pool is 25 X 10 X 1.2 meters. It will therefore not be possible to plunge into the pool.

Søndre Brattholmen

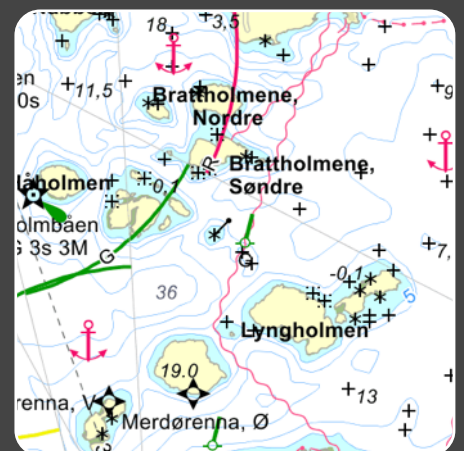

Arendal Sailing Association has its clubhouse and harbour at Søndre Brattholmen just outside Galtesund. You can moor any place, as long as it is not reserved in connection with regattas. The entrance is not difficult, but there are some skerries around the islet you should keep clear of.

When you come to Merdø, it's almost like being set back 100 years in time. Here it is mostly the way it was. Both piers and houses are well preserved, and only the small guest harbor on the west side is reminiscent of modern boating. Many lie at anchor, and then in the same place as the old skippers did when they returned from the high seas. The harbor is somewhat exposed - especially the western dock.

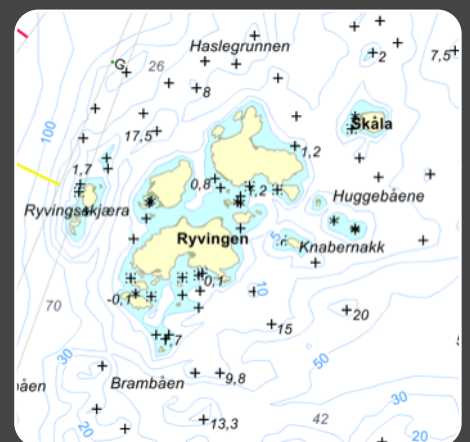

Ryvingen far out in havbrynet and is a nice fair-weather harbor. The three islands are mostly bare, and is roughly equidistant from Grimstad and Arendal. The entrance is from north or west. Both are easy to use. You can anchor in the bay of 3-5 meters or dock to land.

A little closer to Grimstad than Arendal, Fevik is at the heart of Fevikilen. The entrance is easy from the south. Gjestehavnenen is small but nice, and it is rarely crowded anyway. The guest docks are on the west side when you enter the marina. It is 2 meters deep edge at the piers and more shallow closer to shore.

Homborsund

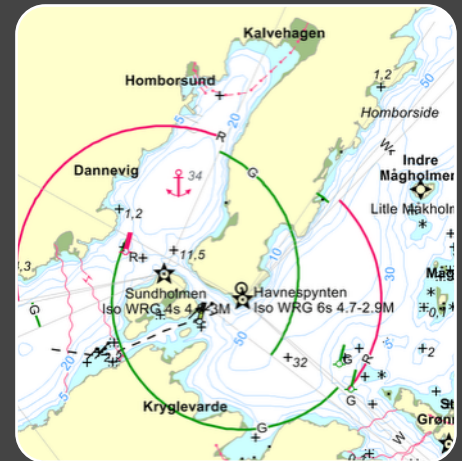

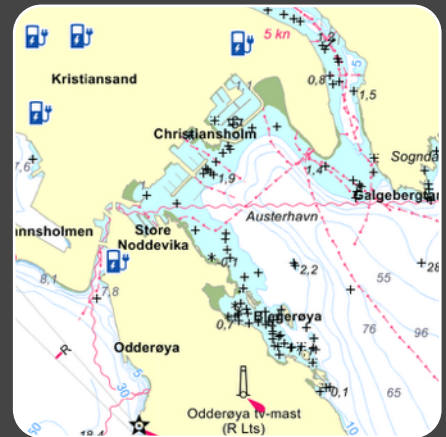
Kristiansand Gjestehavn 39

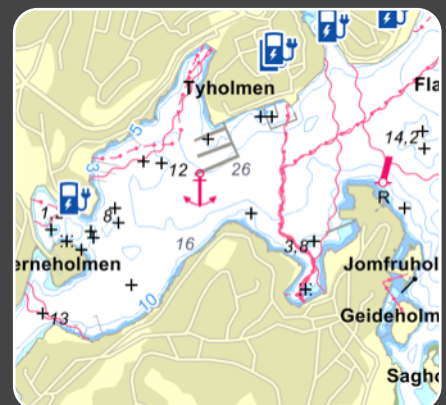
