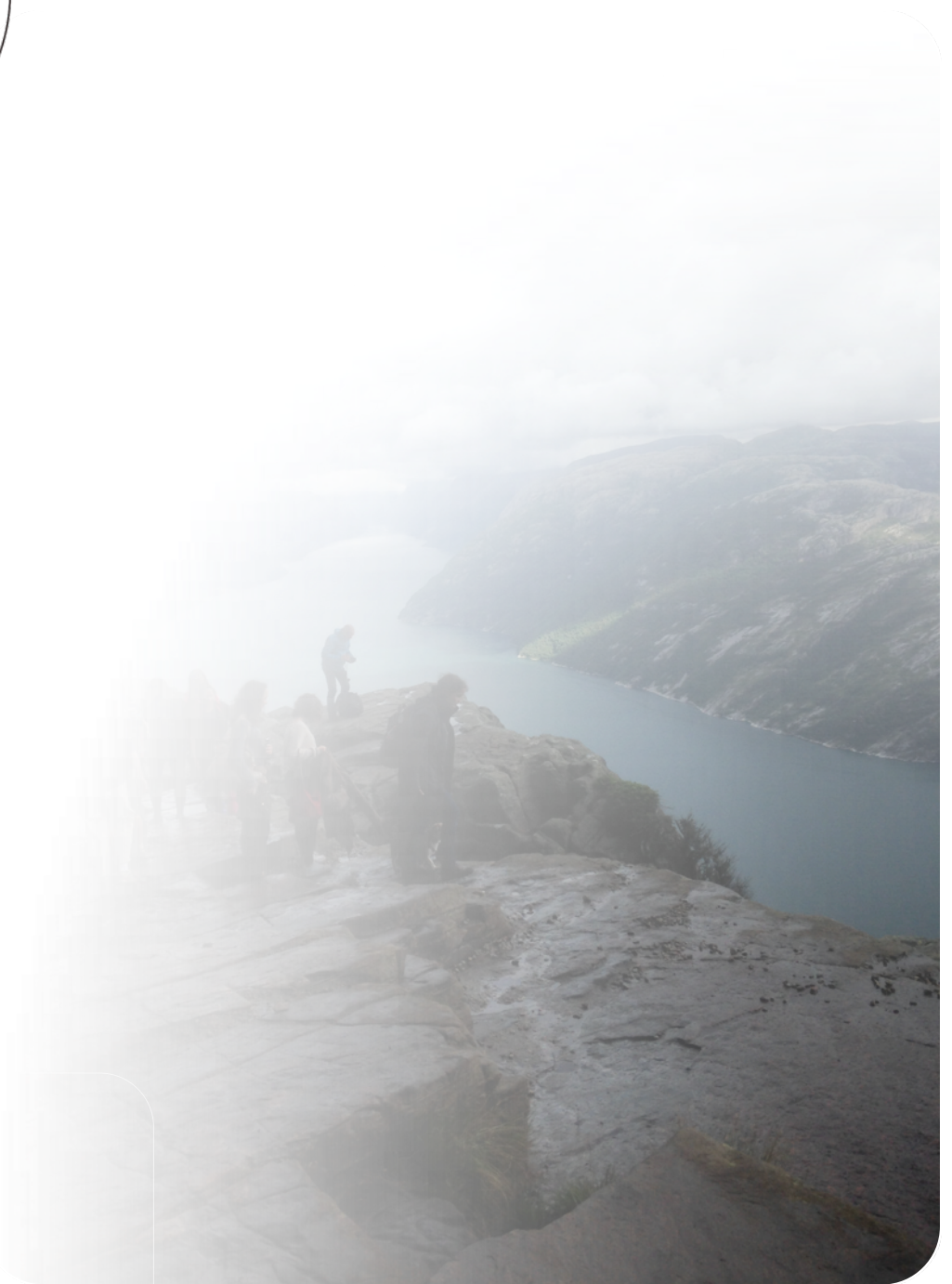

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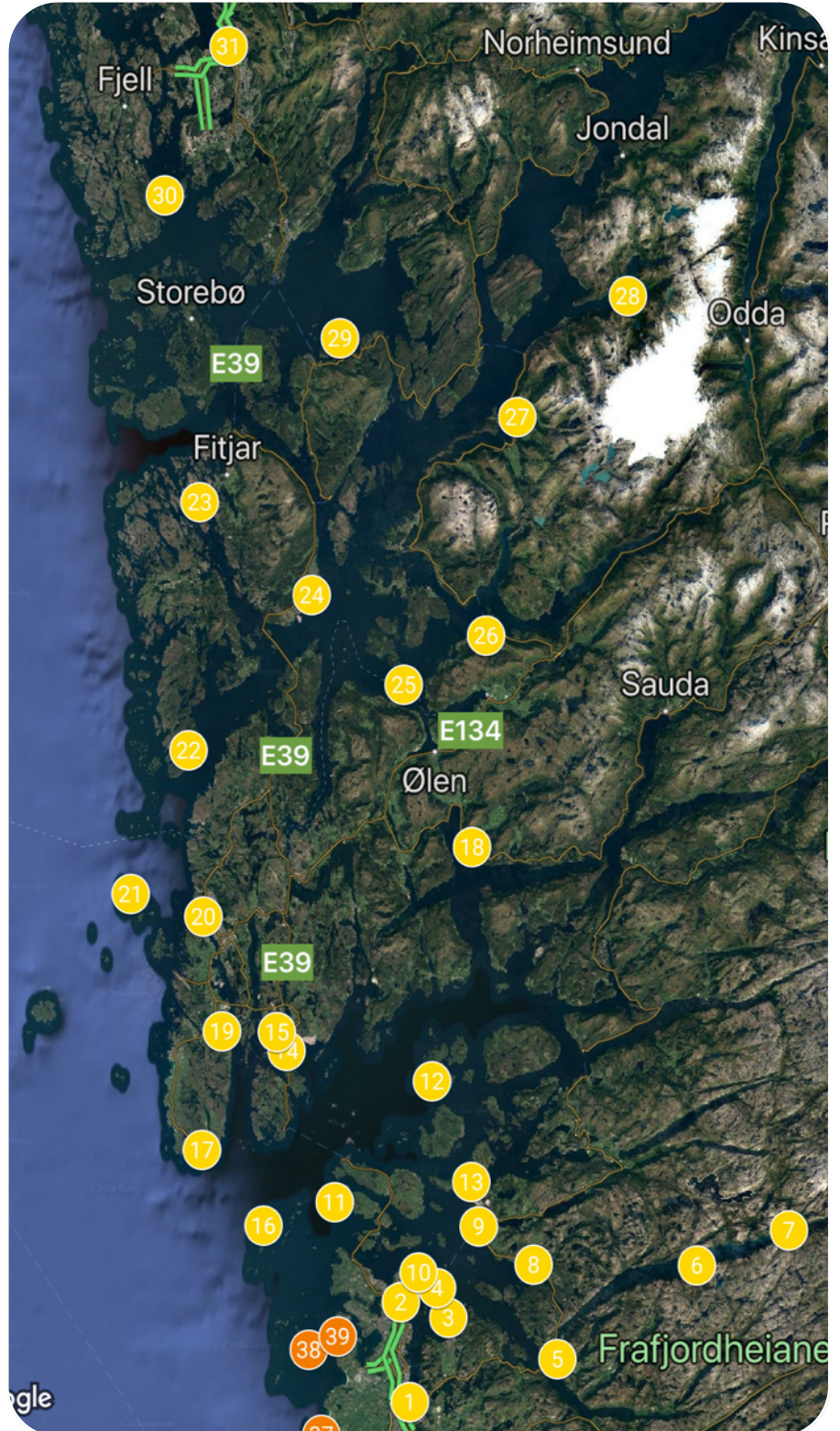

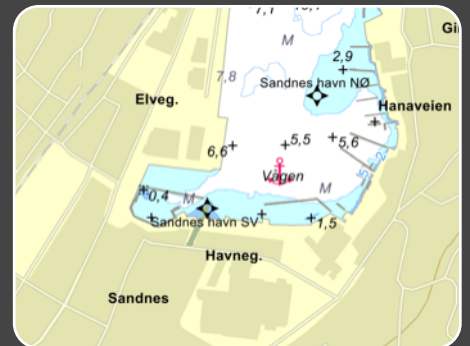

For those who come by boat to Sandnes has a sheltered harbor inner harbor. You are safe here regardless of the weather. The guest harbor has approx. 370 m wooden quai and 2-3 m depth, 110 guest spots. Here is a great service. Water, electricity and renovation. Short distance to both shops and shopping centers. Restaurants and eateries in the immediate vicinity, but at the same time peace and quiet if you wish.

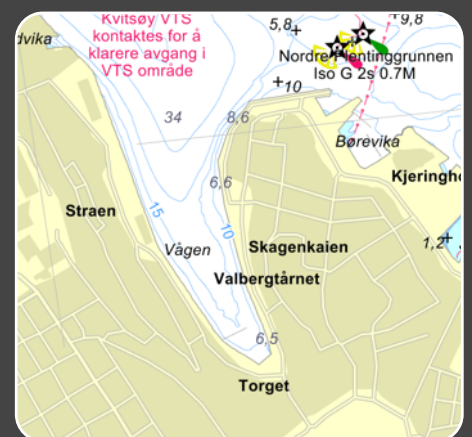


Vågen and Børevigå can seat 51 boats together. The guest harbor is very centrally located in the city center, close to the Norwegian Oil Museum and is within easy walking distance of the city's many attractions.

While you are in Stavanger visit the old town, with their wooden houses, and narrow streets. In Stavanger there were several canned factories. Now shut down. Skipper's grandparents were the first canning shrimp. Near the harbour you find a museum telling the story.

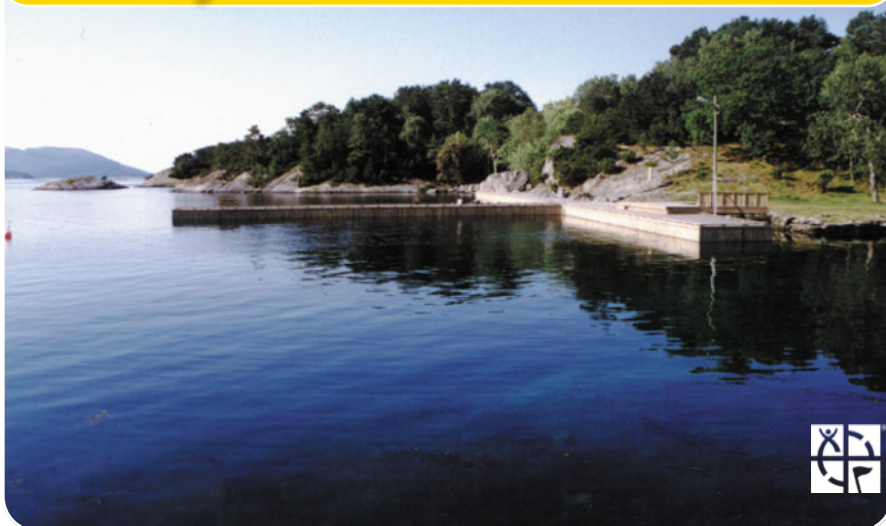

Lindøy

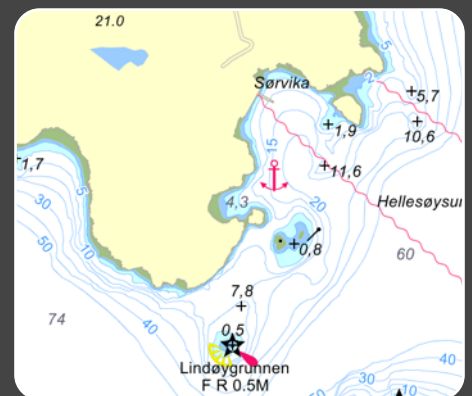

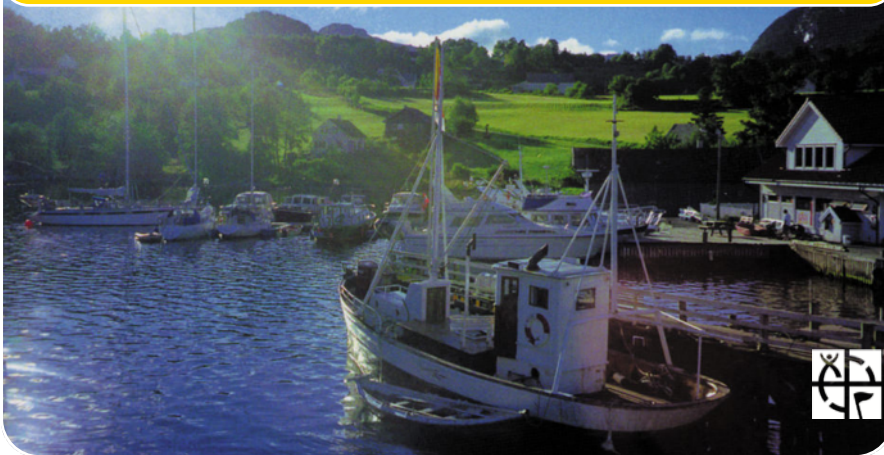

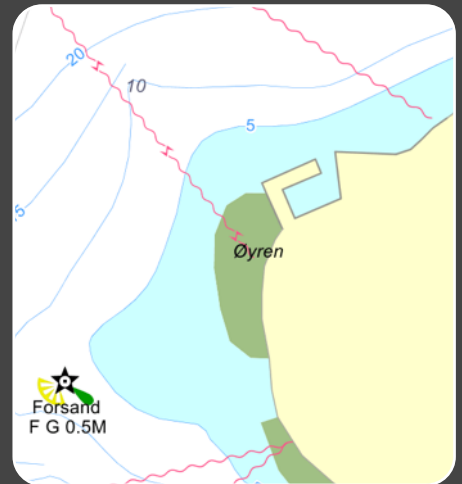

Lysefjorden Marina is located at the entrance of the 42 km long Lysefjord in Ryfylke. One of Norway's most beautiful and wildest fjords, a place everyone should experience. In some places the mountain walls travel 900 meters straight, and the fjord is equally deep. A warm and spacious boat harbor with many guest spots and all amenities. The marina is new, but the trade fair here in Bergevik has more than 100 years of tradition. A little way in, on the harbor side, the majestic pulpit rock shoots up against the sky. Archaeological excavations show that people lived all the way back to the Iron Age. In addition, you can visit the ancient village of Landa.

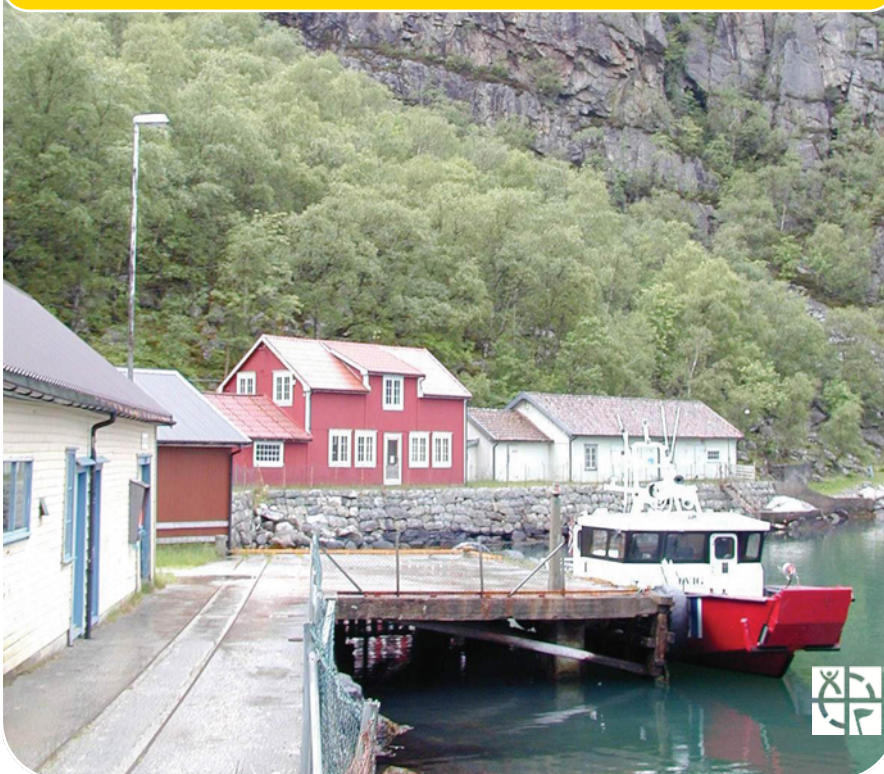

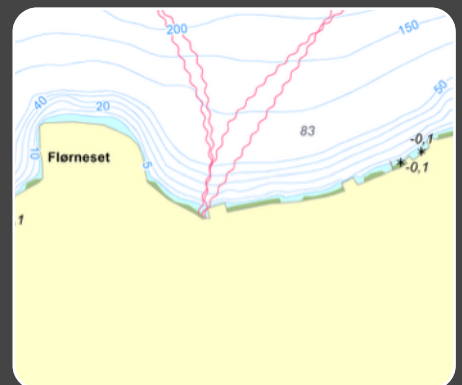

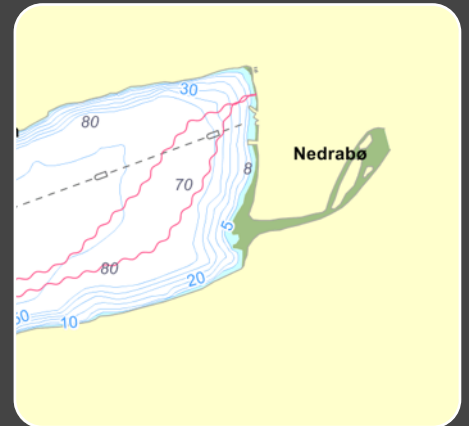


Lysebotn is a small place located at the end of Lysefjorden. A tourist destination with over 120,000 travelers a year. Take a bus from Lysebotn to Øygardsstøl and hike to Kjerag.

Lysevegen, county road 500, to Sirdal passes through 35 hairpin wings up the mountain side and is 29 km long. The road was opened in 1984 and has its highest point of 932 moh. At the top is Øygardstølen which has parking, service building for tourists who go to Kjerag and restaurant.

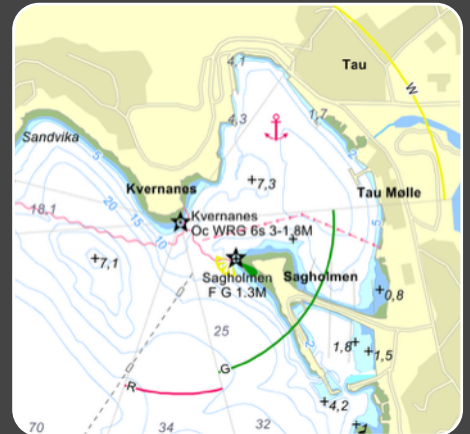

Fjøløy fort is located on Fjøløy northwest of Mosterøy. The location is central to the waters between Tungenes-Kvitsøy and Kvitsøy-Skudenes / Karmøy. A water for shipping traffic. The plant is German-built (1941) and originally consisted of 3-21 cm removable cannons of older type. Fjøløy fort will still be retained in the installation as a very important part of the defense in Rogaland.

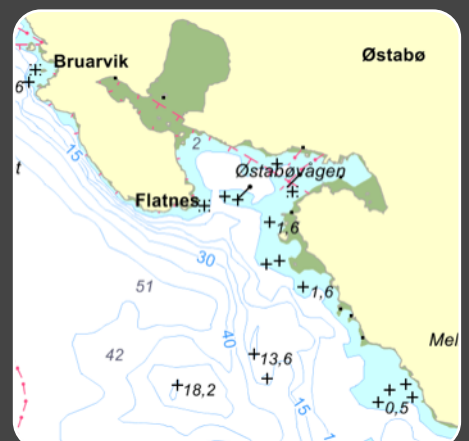

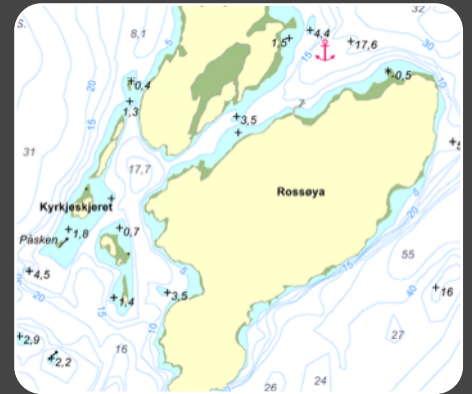


This is one of the best nature ports in Ryfylke. Ryfylke Outdoor Recreation has built solid piers, with beach inside.

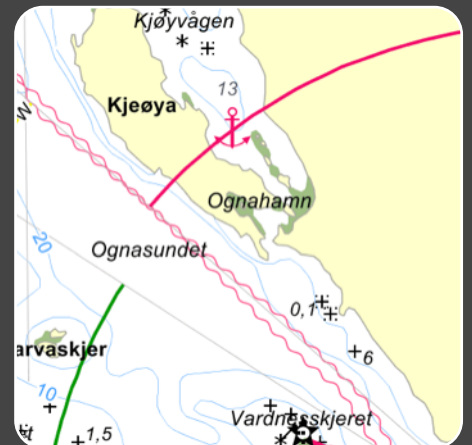

Ognahavn open-air area lies on the west side of Ognøya. The open air area is approx. 50 acres and bleed in with state funds in 1990. The open-air area lies around a natural harbor and has renamed the city. The area is equipped with docks for the boat people, toilet at the parking lot and path between parking and beach area. Ognahavn has been used by the boat people for a long time. Especially before the island became land-safe, this was a quiet and tranquil area of access, many appreciate. Still, there are many who are visiting the area. To Ognahavn they go for swimming, sunbathing, fishing, walking, exploring or just relaxing.

Kvitsøy is the country's smallest municipality measured in area, with only 6.17 km².

On Kvitsøy there is a 3.9 meter tall stone cross from Christianity's first days in Norway. In addition to being a Christian symbol, it was also used as a sailing brand. Close to the stone cross lies the ruins of St. Clement's Church. This was after the legend demolished in 1270. The font of St. Clement's church was found and functions as a baptismal font in today's church, built in 1600.

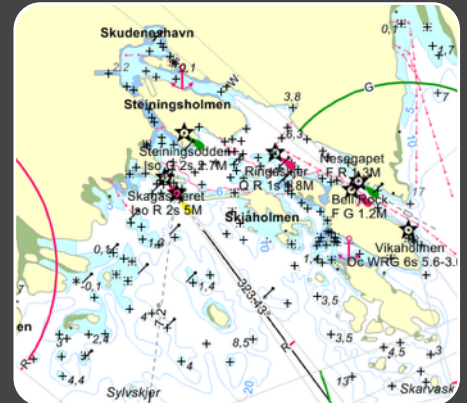

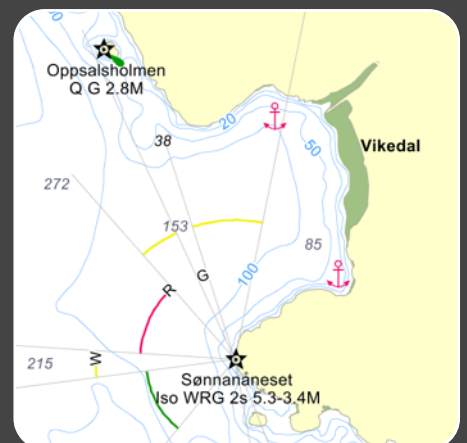

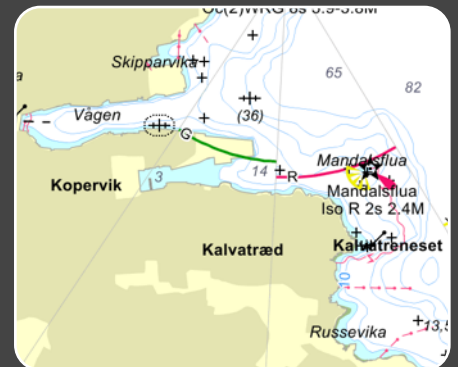

In the Middle Ages, Kopervik was a small town with a good harbor. Ultimately between the two waves, the Vågen and Stangelandsvågen, which the city is built around, is Kopervik harbor. On the hill above the harbor you will find Kopervik's old town, where it is also said that King Sverre had built a castle of wood and peat. Just therefore, this part of the city center is called Treborg today. The city gained a great growth in the 16th and 17th century.

Haugesund became a city because of herring. In the 1840s, over 20,000 men participated in the herring fishery at Sletta just outside Haugesund. Herring had to be salted before it was exported, and Haugesund was a good harbor. Every year hundreds of thousands of barrels of salted herring were sold abroad. The herring achieved good profits that were invested in better fishing gear and larger vessels. The city's fleet grew from 36 vessels in 1856 to 314 in 1876. In 1801 there lived 15 people where Haugesund is now. The number of people rose; from well 100 in 1845 to over 1000 in 1855. The population continued to rise steadily with a thousand every decade so that more than 7000 people lived in Haugesund city center in 1900.

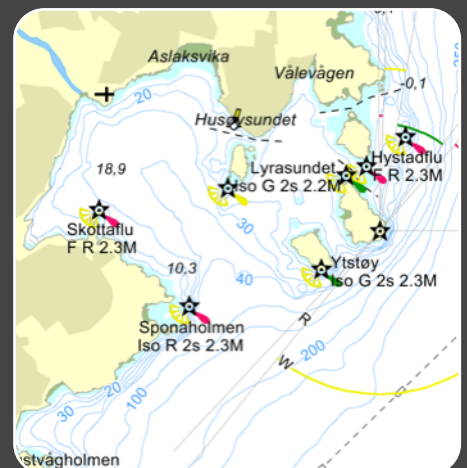

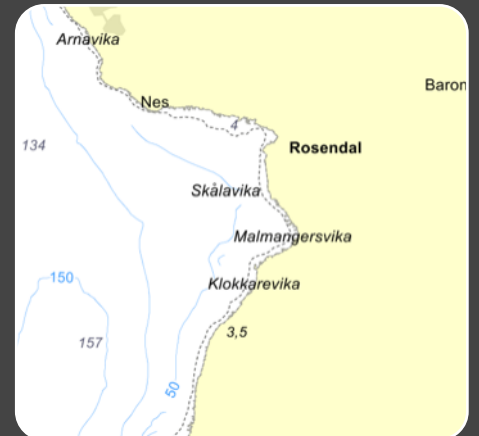

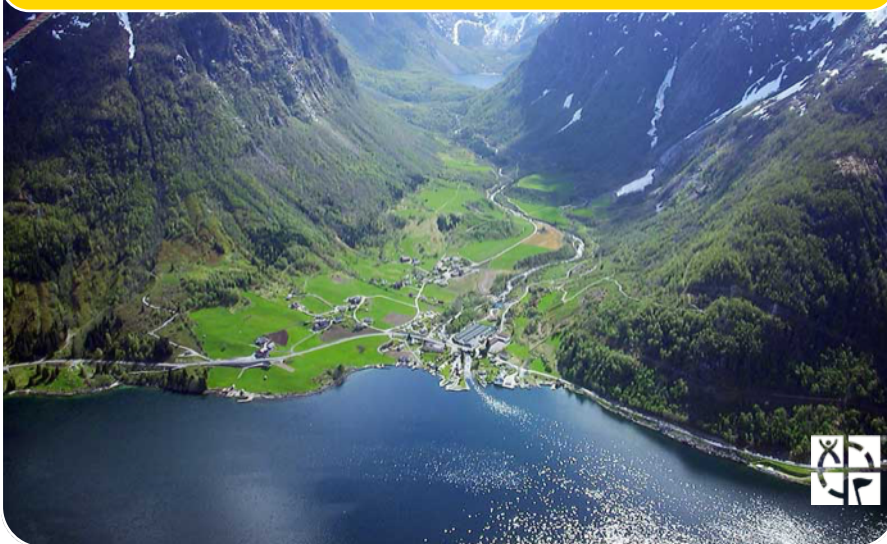

Why take a break at a camping site in Bondhus. This spot is an excellent base for glacier experience. The road up to Bondhusvatnet were built in 1890 and there was a quarry cabin, Breidablikk, at the edge of the glacier.

Bondhus glacier is an expatriate from Folgefonna, a so-called dalbre (valley glacier), in Kvinnherad in Hordaland. Breen extending westward down Bondhusbreen valley opening at Sundal by Mauranger fjord. It is about 4 km long and has a fall of about 1100 m

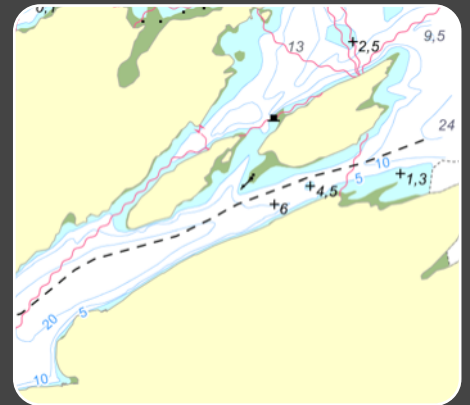


Solstråleøya is located in idyllic Godøysund near Tysnes in Hardanger, and is worth a visit. The island is today a free area since 1991. Before that, the Norwegian royal family owned the island for more than eighty years. Here are beautiful hiking trails and a very special vegetation. Plants and trees you do not expect to find on these edges.

Remains of foundations tells us that people have previously lived here. But not everybody knows that there has been a small castle here. Owned by an eccentric Englishman, and a young girl nobody really knew who was. For whom was it really that filed paths and created the alien vegetation

Lerøy fort

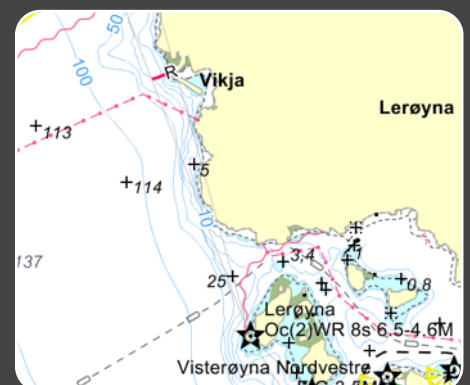

Lerøy fort was part of Bergen's fortifications. The fortifications were built to protect the inlet to Bergen from attacks from the sea. The fortress was divided into an internal fortification with an outer fortification. Inner fortification consisted of the Kvarven and Hellen forts. Outer fortifications consisted of fortresses Lerøy, Faroe Islands, Herdla and Håøy. Named «Bergen fortifications» until 1937. In 1934 the fortress became part of the coastal artillery. The fortress was closed in 1961.

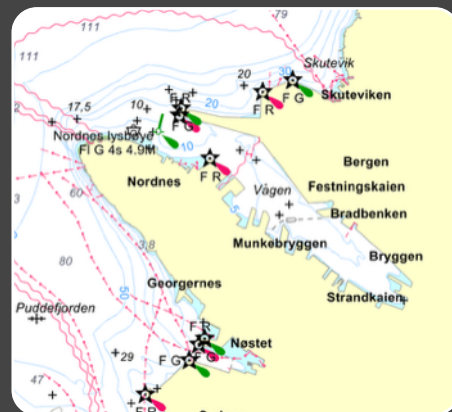
